SAMS-participation at seminar on reassessing motorway investments

At a seminar arranged by the Swedish Environmental Protection Agency on January 21st, SAMS-researcher Jacob Witzell was invited to discuss and comment upon the recent initiative by the Welsh government to pause and reassess planned investments in new motorways. At the seminar, the Deputy Minister for Climate Change, Mr. Lee Waters, outlined the arguments behind the decision, and the work they are currently undertaking to investigate how policy packages might provide viable and more socially just and sustainable alternatives to additional capacity increases in road infrastructure. At a follow-up seminar in April, civil servants involved in reappraising the investment scheme will present how they practically go about the reassessment.

The Workhub in Tullinge has become a pilot project

From 1 February the <u>Tullinge Workhub</u> has become a pilot project together with Botkyrka Municipality, Vakansa, Smart Resenär and KTH. The purpose of the project is to concretize market potential and conditions for "scaling up" by understanding relevant target groups and their willingness to pay. The goal is to better understand the demand among Tullinge residents and the local business community to be able to plan for expanded use of the concept.

Co-design workshops to develop mobility service concepts


During December and January, two co-design workshops were held to creatively develop mobility service concepts to set up and explore in the living lab in Riksten. As the living lab aims to "stage" a possible and more sustainable near future, the service concepts were designed for this. The workshops were therefore based on a future scenario where publicly provided transport has been widened to include other types of mobility services. Today, these services are not seen as viable in the outer suburbs, and they are in most cases only available in the city centers. The workshops were held with representatives from our key partners Botkyrka municipality and Region Stockholm public transport, as well as several market actors, including mobility service operators and vehicle providers. The results were a number of new service concepts and service combinations, some of which are now set to be further developed and explored by Riksten citizens. An interesting insight was the need for mobility service providers to cooperate to reduce the costs of providing a service infrastructure in less densely-populated areas. There was also a rich discussion regarding identified limitations to how public transport is commissioned today.

Mistra SAMS participates at exhibition Zero City

Zero City will offer an interactive experience where visitors will meet possible future scenarios and can even be part of the planning process of carbon neutral cities in order to reach climate goals.
