From Ambition to Reality – the Unwinding of Carbon Reduction Commitments in the UK Transport Sector

Further, the role of science in achieving net zero transport, particularly in light of the high public support for climate action, will be discussed.

Greg Marsden is Professor of Transport Governance at the Institute for Transport Studies at the University of Leeds.

He is an expert on climate and energy policy in the transport sector and has researched issues surrounding the design and implementation of new policies for over 20 years covering a range of issues.
